WEB/VIDEOTAPING PERMISSION FORM

A common practice that coaches have used in helping to improve a player's individual skills as well as team's overall performance is to videotape/film each player/team in the areas of attacking, defense, and setting during practice and/or tournament play. The use of this technology helps to provide the player/team an opportunity to observe their skills and target their weaknesses. OSV's goal is to provide each player with individual feedback throughout the season in order to provide an effective way for athletes to be objective and to make decisions as a team how to be more successful.

Videotapes/filming will not be used on Internet social networks (YouTube, Facebook, MySpace). The videos will be stored on the Ocean State Volleyball website under a secured network that is password protected which would be used for educational purposes ONLY. The purpose of holding these videos on the website would allow for each player to see their improvement in their skills throughout the season. Taping would take place periodically throughout the season to see individual/team progress, and during one of the last practices. OSV Coach will inform parents when taping will take place if the parent(s) would like to be present at that time.
